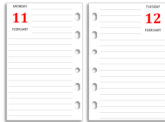

We held our annual Curriculum Evening on Tuesday 19th September. The staff would like to thank the parents that did attend and we hope you found it informative and useful.

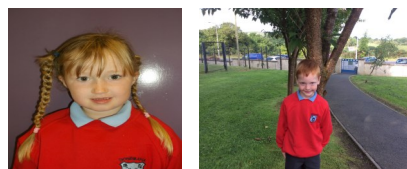


Welcome, Welcome!
